Dear Lenten Journeyers,

On Ash Wednesday we met on the road marked with a sense of humanity, humility, confession and forgiveness. This day began a beautiful season of introspection and realignment to our walk with Jesus. Generational Blessing

Everyone is invited to the **all-church conference** • **on March 8**th after worship service to vote on the following proposals. See more details in Ad Board article on page 2.

1. Honor the legacy of the historic portion of the church with a new roof in Fall 2021.

Action: Vote on this recommendation, recognizing this is a long-term plan and acknowledgment of the building's value.

2. Remodel addition to open an Early Childhood Learning Center (ECLC) in Spring 2021.

- We create a space to meet an overwhelming need of early childhood learning.
- The new shared space would provide room for a daycare/preschool (ECLC) for infants to 5 yearolds along with an after-school program, large fellowship hall/play area, remodeled kitchen, and updated accessible bathrooms.

- Laree Jessop, director of Bitterroot Early Learning Center, desires to partner and run the ECLC business.
- Even with a mortgage, the ECLC becomes a selfsustaining and income-generating ministry for the church.

Action: On 3/8, vote whether or not to move forward in research.

Timeline:

- March 8: Hear proposals, ask questions, & vote on plan to gather info & create building committee to research
- March April 2020: Gather: architectural plans, cost estimate, preliminary financial plan & committee req.
- April 26, 2020: Charge conference, final vote on proposal

The Administration Board endorses the following proposals as expressions of ministry and good stewardship. Please come to the All-Church Conference on March 8 after service to hear more information, ask questions and vote on the next phase of these proposals.

Roof Proposal

- Install a new roof on the historic portion of the building in summer/fall 2021 that maintains the integrity of the historic aesthetic of the building.
- Seek alternative ways of using the fellowship hall space such as redesigning it with additional square footage for a shared space with a fellowship hall, kitchen and daycare/preschool as an extension of our ministry and new source of income.
- Do a capital campaign to raise \$40,000 to commit \$80,000 toward a matching grant
- If the grant comes through, the full funding will be available. If we're not awarded the grant, we take out a loan to cover the rest of the expense.

The Numbers:

The cost ranges between \$282,000 and \$320,000 as given by the Sept. 2018 architectural assessment. The difference in cost comes from the various products available to maintain the integrity of the ascetic look of a shake roof. These costs include all of Target Market the labor, parts, permits, and disposal of current roof as well as any structural needs for the building, both the historical section, the fellowship hall, and joining area.

Current financial capital: \$40,000 has been collected through donations, memorials, and specific capital campaign funds.

What's new? A Historic Preservation Grant

- The MT state legislature set forth a bill to fund historic building projects up to \$500,000 per project. We would ask for about \$300,000 for a new roof.
- Grants are due Feb. 28, 2020. A public meeting must occur to inform the community of the environmental impact (which there will be none).
- Lorraine Roach, a grant writing consultant and former executive director of the Main Street Association, offered her services to help SUMC win this grant.
- Two ways to be more competitive
 - Dedicate money toward the matching grant money received.
 - Illustrate ways economic stimulus will occur during & after the project.

Grants will be awarded June 2021. No work done before receiving the grant money could be retroactively refunded.

Early Childhood Learning Center Proposal The Story

Stevensville UMC prides itself on being a "village" for families and children. This community of faith cares for members and visitors with Sunday school, childcare during Sunday service, VBS, and the more intangibles of mentoring kids during the week, being a safe group/space that appreciates a child just as they are, and championing the growth and spark of God within. This dedication to kids and families extends to the partnership offered to WIC, Pantry Partners, Clothes Closet, Stevensville Public School, Scouts, and 4-H.

Meanwhile, the Early Childhood Education (ECE) capacity in Stevensville and the county falls way below need. Parents in Stevensville and surrounding communities search far and wide for care space for their kids with quality learning being a bonus at times.

When we partner this gift of SteviUMC to the need of the kids and families of our area. we can live into God's call.

A recent study from Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services, Early Childhood Services Bureau stated that Ravalli county has the capacity to care for only 35.6% of children, 29% of infants & toddlers (Sept, 2019). The population in Stevensville, in Ravalli County grew in 2019 by 4.64% over a five-year trend, leading us to believe this growing trend will continue (Mission Insite). Residents in the age range of 25-45 were the second highest population growth at 1.9%, trailing only retired people (65-over). There is a need for childcare in Stevensville, especially for working families and single-parent homes. There are no centers for infant/toddler care in Stevensville. The Head Start Preschool in Stevensville has a waiting list. There are only nine facilities in Ravalli County for any type of childcare or preschool.

At the same time, families need affordable childcare options. The average cost of full-time child care for an infant in Montana is \$9,000 a year; average annual cost for full-time child care for a fouryear old in the state is \$7,900 (MT Early Childhood Assessment, 9/2019). The ECLC must balance supporting the ministry of SUMC with providing affordable childcare. Meanwhile, partnerships with Head Start and Stars and the food program can drastically reduce the overhead.

LENTEN PRACTICES

Wednesday Morning Bible Study at 10:00: *The Wind, the Fountain, and the Fire*

In *The Wind, the Fountain and the Fire*, Mark Barrett, a Benedictine monk of Worth Abbey, offers a Lenten pathway through scripture, opening the gateway of sacred imagery as a mode of prayerful reflection. For each week of Lent he has selected a different image: the Dust; the Mountain; the Well; the Light and the Tomb. In these richly imagined biblical symbols we are invited to find keys which can unlock both our experience of scripture and our understanding of our own hearts.

Simple Meal for Soft Landings Scholarships

Commit to eating a simple meal (can of soup, rice & beans, or grill cheese sandwich) once in the week. Allow this act be a meditation on the abundance in

your life and the gratitude you can offer God for God's constant sustaining. Reflect on others- Stevi neighbors, people experiencing homelessness, refugees, civilians in war-torn areas, the poor- who would find even a simple meal a luxury.

Put in the soup can the money you don't spend on the meal. We'll give this money to Soft Landings, a Missoula-based organization who works with recently relocated refugees. The money will fund a youth after school tutoring space, scholarships for such activities as driver's lessons, youth soccer league registration, and summer trips to Flathead Lake.

Stewardship and Finance: Provide financial review and overview, promote our involvement in ministries, pay bills, track all income and expenses, count offering and prepare deposits.
